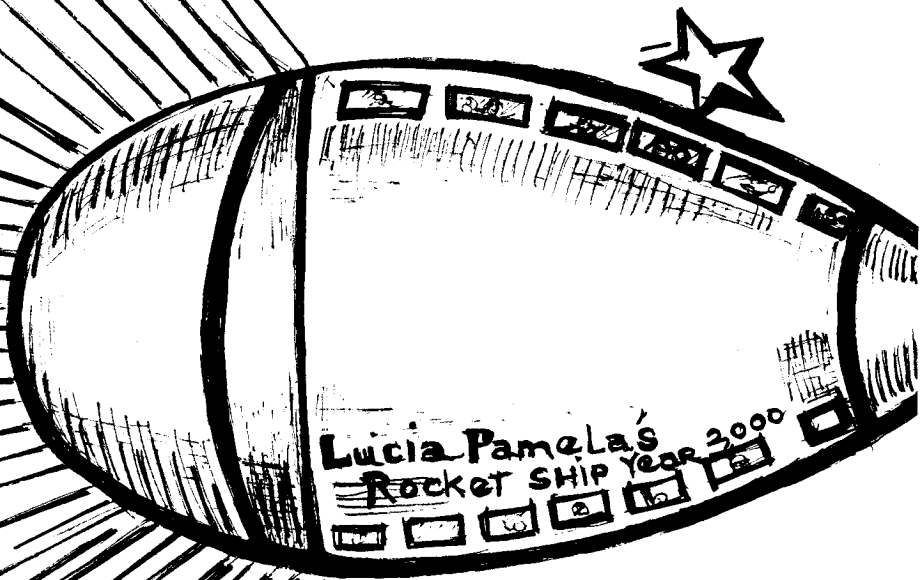

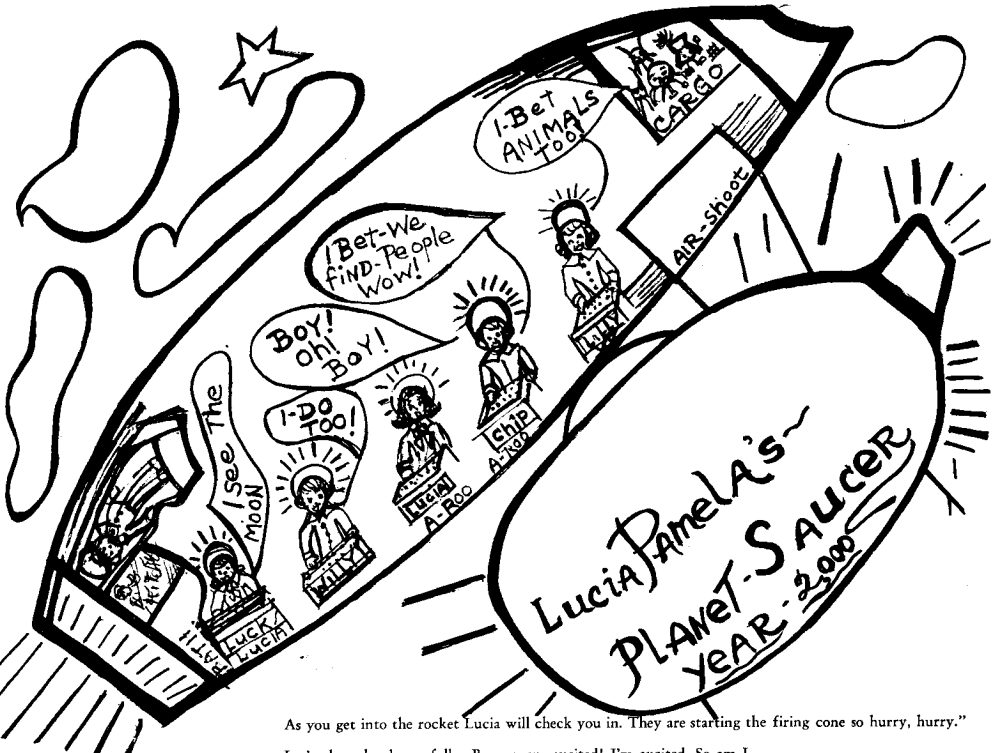
Whee: We're ready to go. We all will leave the Earth, going to the Moon!!

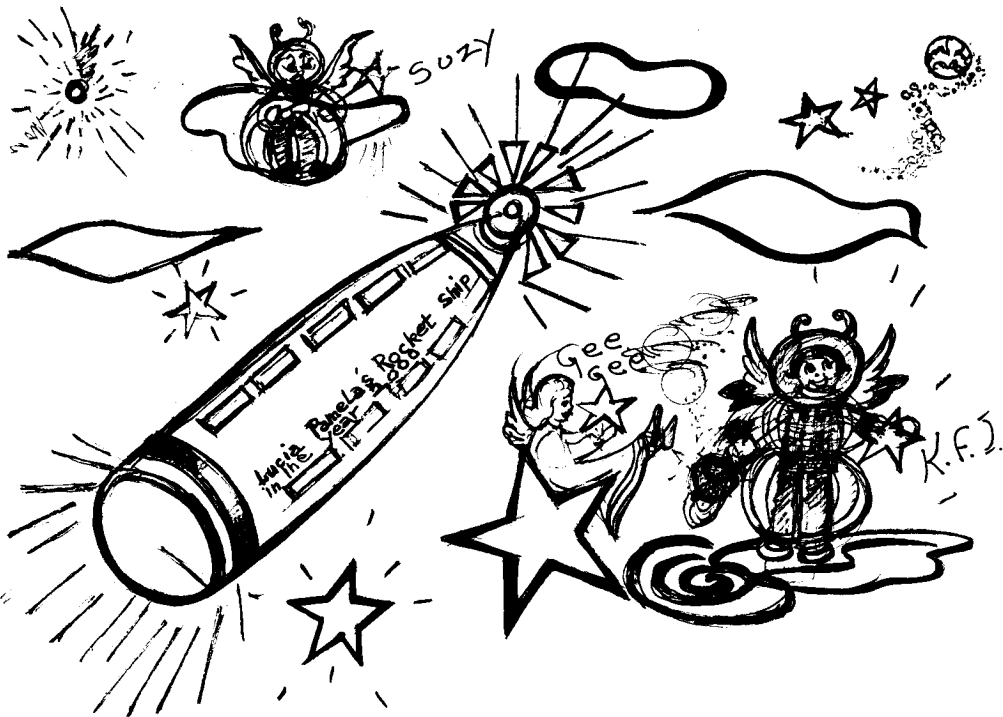
As you get into the rocket Lucia will check you in. They are starting the firing cone so hurry, hurry."

Let's close the doors, folks. Boy are we excited! I'm excited. So am I.

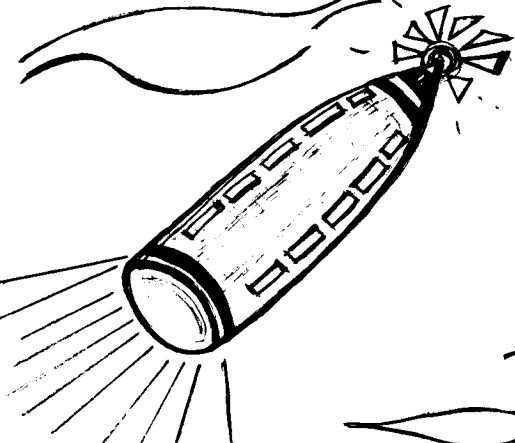


Maybe there will be mountains and trees. We don't know what we will find.

Wonder what we will find on the Moon. Maybe lakes full of fish. I love to fish. So do I.



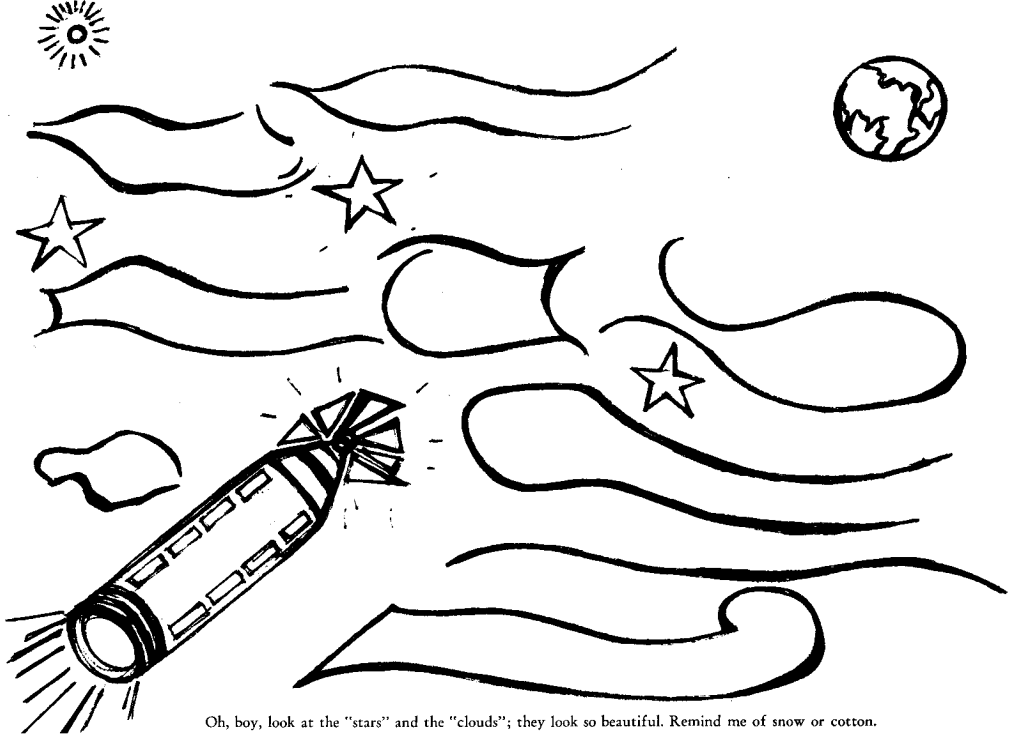

I wonder, how the weather is on the Moon.

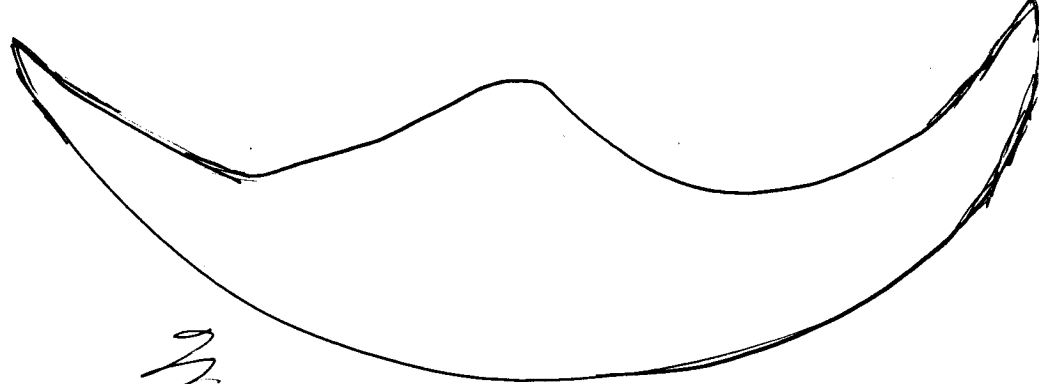
Look how small it looks.

It won't be long now. We'll be landing soon. Let's eat — I'm hungry. So am I. So am I.

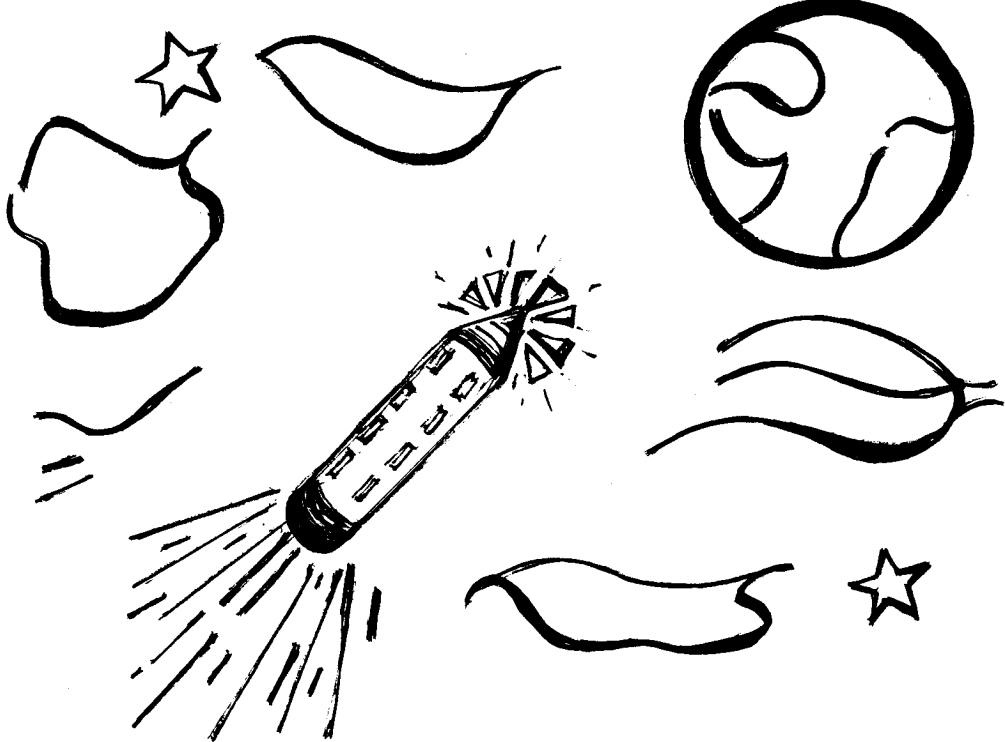


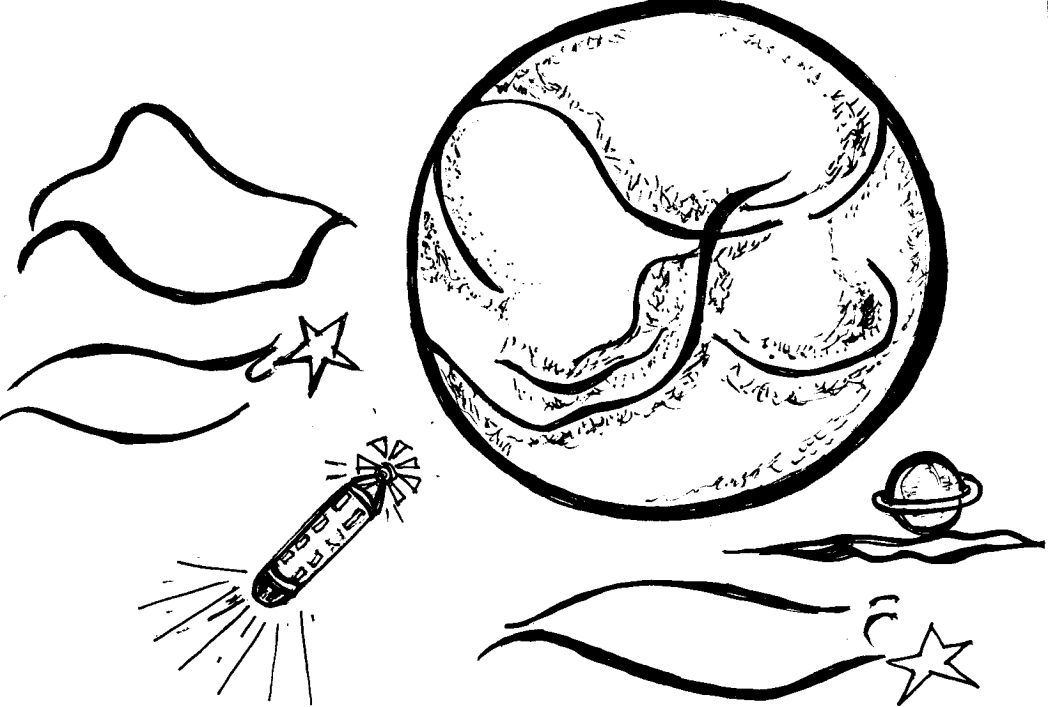

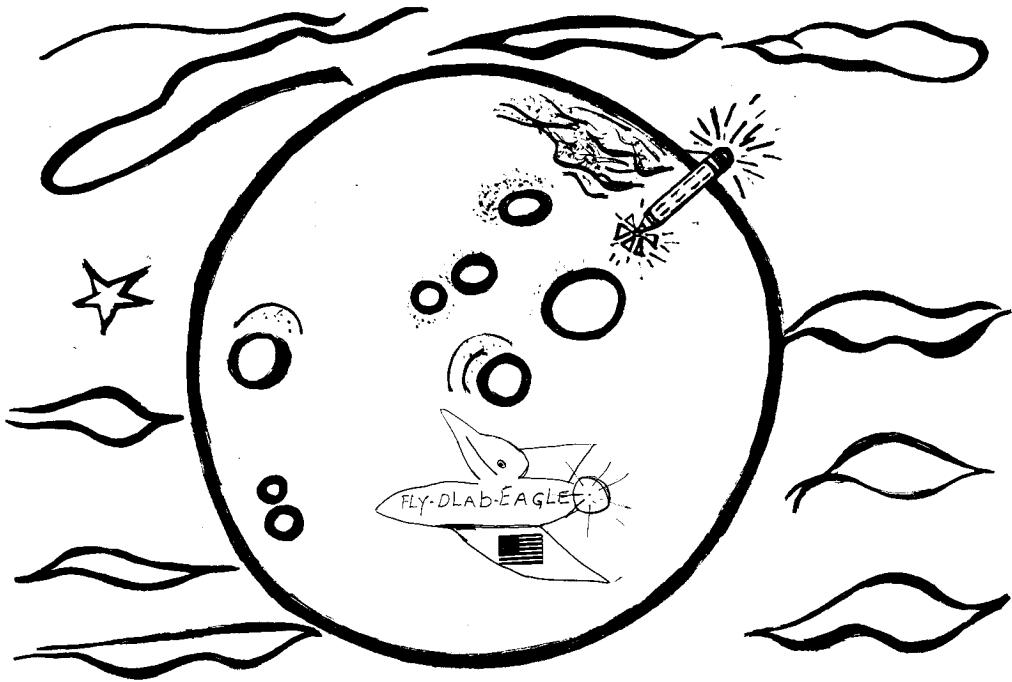
Oh,!! look!! at the Man in the Moon.



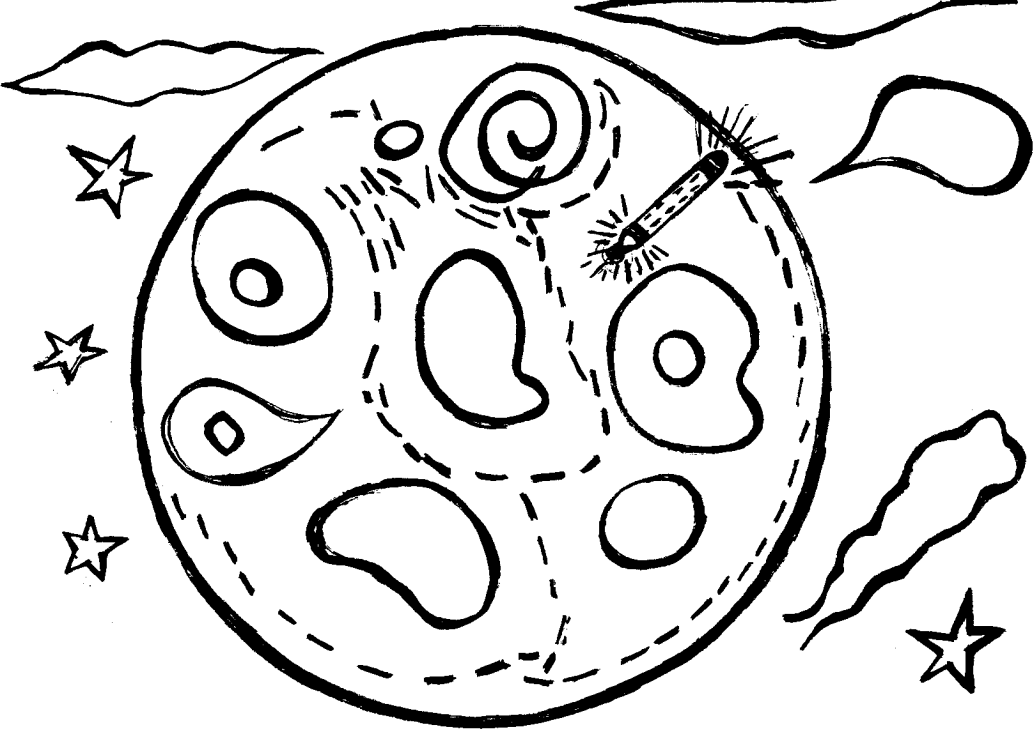


Isn't this great!! — we can't see the Earth.



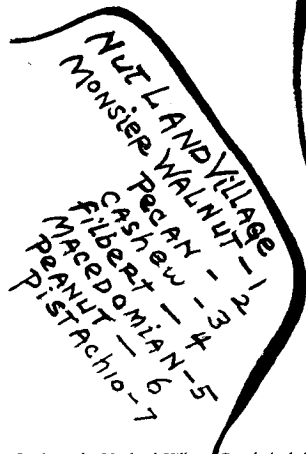
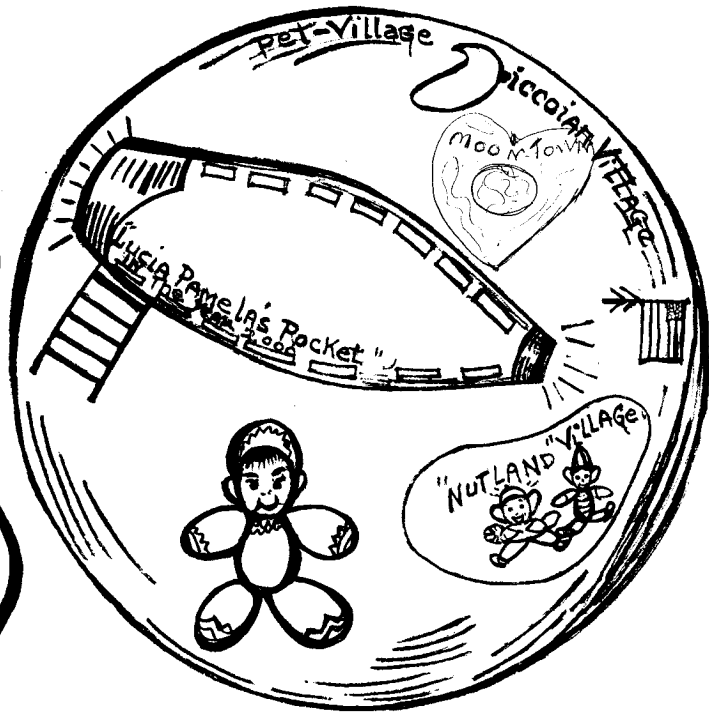


Get ready to land everybody. Don't leave your seat until the rocket stops.

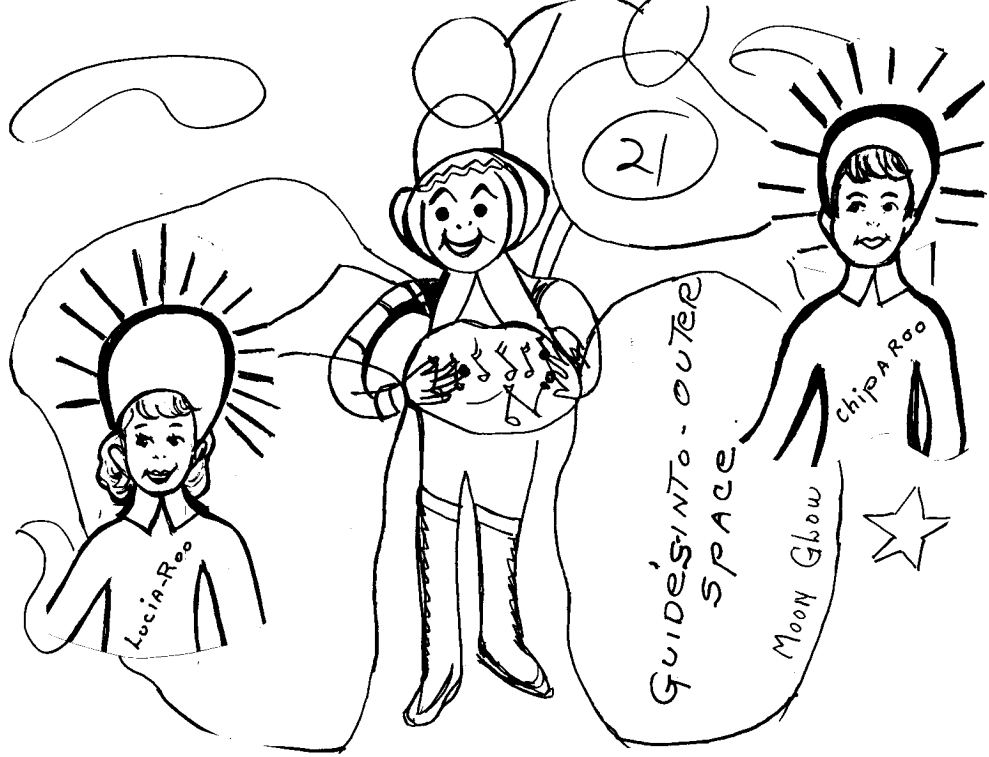

The first rocket took about three months to build, and so many wanted to go another rocket was built.

After they land on the Moon, they will visit other planets, Venus, Mars and in going thru the sky they find a new planet that has never been found.

The rockets have special bunks to sleep, plus cargo space for the animals, eating spaces, rest-rooms, special chairs, special remote control T.V. and landing gears for the panel to see when they get close to the Moon, a large balloon type saucer will be blown up and it will carry the rocket to the Moon, at the time the rocket lands one by one all will walk down the ladder, with special boots and head-gear until the rocket is emptied, then after the landing the portable homes will be set up and much to their surprise Moon-people are found on the Moon. Her book *The Antique Clock, Don Juan* and others were a success, director of the Soldan High School Band was Miss Cinderella, also played Venus in Spookland at the Odean Theatre, in St. Louis, Mo. Taught Sunday School and music in school. Was Miss St. Louis. Produced and wrote many shows for Eastern Star, Girl Scout leader and organizer, Campfire Girls and Cub Scouts leader. Formed an all girl orchestra, Togo's and Musical Pirates. Played Statler Hotel. The Mo. A. C. Club in St. Louis, was on K.M.O.X., W.E.W many hours in charity work, produced shows for the U.S.O. Was the first Mother Goose at Fresno Storyland for everyone. Had the Encouragement Hour on KARM radio, KGST, KYNO, KMJ also on the stage of the Moon Glo outdoor theatre, taught and produced music and wrote shows for the private school in Hollywood, Florida.
